My research area is historical theology, with a specialization in Jewish-Christian relations. I focus on the 19th to 21st century, particularly as it concerns the Holocaust and antisemitism. I am interested in the encounter between Judaism and Christianity (particularly Catholicism) within the context of the Second World War, both before and after, examining the history of Christian anti-Judaism, the fundamental revision of Catholic theology following the Holocaust, and the Church's ongoing role in addressing antisemitism today. Applying historical methodology, critical analysis, and interdisciplinary research, I aim to confront antisemitism, foster interreligious and interideological understanding, and ensure the lessons of the Holocaust inform our present. Through my publications, presentations, and teaching, I strive to preserve memory and historical consciousness for future generations while encouraging inclusive, reflective dialogue in the areas of theology, religious studies, and history.
